Foreign Language & Cultures - there are no longer residency requirements.

Professional Electives: Complete 1 option: 1) Complete minor in an area such as Communication Sciences, Educational Psychology, International Studies, Leadership Studies, Medical Humanities, Nonprofit Studies, Poverty Studies, Religion, Women's and Gender Studies.

2) Select 15 hrs from the following courses: Any 3000-4000 level CFS course, CLA 3381, LS 3305, LS 4320, PUBH 3325, PUBH 4327, REL 3382, REL 3390, SOC 3311; SOC 3355, SOC 3360, SOC 4353, SWO 4316.

- A grade of "C" or better in all family and consumer sciences courses (ADM, CFS, FFCS, ID & NUTR) used for the major and a "C" average in courses taken outside the department.

Change of Major/Transfer Requirements: only during eligibility period (at the end of the semester after grades are posted through the 5th day of class in the following term.
