The sequence listed above is based on two 18-hour majors. Electives may also be used towards another major in the Business School or a minor or secondary major outside of the Business School. Elective hours will vary for each student, must be taken for a grade, and are only needed to reach the 124-hour minimum to graduate. Course selection is subject to availability and fit within each semester.

Boldface type – Requirements for admission to the Business School. All BOLDED courses in first year must be taken at Baylor unless transferred prior to matriculation.

*Business Core

Personal Development: Choose either one Lifetime Fitness course, AS 1111, MILS 1111, or MUEN 1102 (Marching Band)

Language/Communication: (3-4 hours) Choose one of the following options: ACC 3310, BUS 3330, JOU/FDM 3372, ENG 3000-4000 level course, PWR 3000-4000 level or Foreign Language (including American Sign Language).

Calculus: (3 hours) MTH 1321 requires a SAT math score of 650 or higher, an ACT math score of 27 or higher or an ALEKS score of 80 or higher. MTH 1321 (Calculus I) is preferred, though MTH 1309 (Calculus for Business Students) is accepted.

IANKAMER SCHOLAR REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BBA

A Hankamer Scholar must complete a minimum of 24 credit hours at Baylor, maintain a minimum 3.4 cumulative Baylor GPA; complete HASC 1101, BUS 1350, ENG 1310 (or BIC 1323), MTH 1321 or MTH 1309, ECO 1380, QBA 2302, ACC 2303, and ACC 2304 with a minimum grade of "C" in each course. Post-matriculation, students must complete all Hankamer Scholar Requirements in-residence. Hankamer Scholars must meet the pre-requisites listed on all business courses. If these requirements are not met, the student will transition to the Pre-Business degree plan.

DECLARATION OF MAJOR IN HANKAMER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Once a Scholar has satisfactorily completed the Hankamer Scholar Requirements including earning a minimum 3.4 cumulative Baylor GPA, then the student will declare their specific major(s) within the School of Business.

Hankamer Scholars may progress into upper division courses (3000-4000) if they have successful taken the suggested (advised) sequence of lower core courses and should logically begin taking an upper division business core course. However, under no circumstances will a Hankamer Scholar be allowed to take a course in a specific major until they have completed all of the Scholars Requirements listed above.

External transfer (students transferring to Baylor from another institution) and internal transfer (students transferring majors within Baylor) are not permitted to enter the Hankamer Scholars program.

COURSE REPETITION

A student may repeat a course for which his or her highest earned grade is a "C-" or below. The course should be repeated during the following semester in which the student is enrolled at Baylor. No BBA student may retake a grade of "C" or higher.

If a Hankamer Scholar earns less than a "C" in one of the Hankamer Scholar required classes, the student will be transitioned to the Pre-Business degree plan. Pre-Business students may repeat only once no more than two of the admission requirements (see BBA Pre-Business Degree MAP) to remain in the BBA degree. Students failing any of the courses due to the attendance policy may be required to change degree programs.

See school or departmental major/minor requirements for policies governing the repetition of courses in specified academic areas and specific major requirements.

BBA MAJORS

A BBA student must complete coursework leading toward a major of 12 to 18 hours in a particular field. A student may choose a major from the following: Accounting, Economics, Entrepreneurship and Corporate Innovation, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business (second major only), Management, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Professional Selling, Risk Management and Insurance, Supply Chain Management.

HANKAMER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS – IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Students who earn a cumulative Baylor GPA between 3.0-3.39, drop Calculus and/or the Research Writing course, or have an Incomplete in any course will be placed on Hankamer Scholar Academic Notice.
- Students who drop one of the Hankamer Scholar Required Courses, excluding Calculus and/or the Research Writing course, will be transitioned to the Pre-Business degree plan.
- Students who earn less than a "C" in one of the Hankamer Scholar required courses will be transitioned to the Pre-Business degree plan.
- Students who do not earn a cumulative Baylor GPA of a 3.0 after Fall, Spring or Summer terms will be transitioned to the Pre-Business degree plan, provided they are still eligible for the BBA degree.
- Students not completing the Hankamer Scholar requirements by the end of their first year will be transitioned to the Pre-Business degree plan.
- Students must attend all business courses at least 75% of all class meetings. A student failing to meet Hankamer Scholar Requirements due to the attendance policy may be required to change degree programs.
- After entering Baylor, a student may transfer in a maximum of 15 hours. Hankamer Scholar required courses must be taken in-residence postmatriculation.
